The Rio Grande Joint Venture (RGJV) is a bird conservation partnership of federal, state, non-profit, and research organizations in the U.S. and Mexico. RGJV and partners work to achieve voluntary conservation of birds, their habitats, and the ecosystems that support life throughout the Chihuahuan Desert, Tamaulipan Brushlands, and Laguna Madre of Mexico.

Birds are sensitive indicators of the condition of ecosystems that support life.
